The table below should help you answer your questions.

Intention	Characteristics	Structure
Inform objectively (no opinions)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - only important facts - start with more important facts (from the most important to the least one) - facts well explained, simple and precise. 	Title -1st paragraph: What? Where? When? For who? -2nd paragraph: summary of less important details. -Illustrations

You have been asked to add a brief summary of two interesting games the children might like. Without telling all of it, write something that will intrigue them.

1. Guess the ... YARK!

Make holes in the lids of a few boxes or cover bowls with blackout fabric so the children can slip their hand into a container and guess what they are touching. Is that a zombie brain? vampire blood? extra-terrestrial eyes? worms?

2. The pumpkin and the skittles

Younger children can play bowling with ghost face toilet paper rolls and a three-hole pumpkin ball!

Great question! Usually, a newspaper is written in the third person (e. g., The children will have the chance to ...), and a magazine will often use the second person). I would use the **third person**.

- As you have learned in previous activities, make sure you don't leave errors.
