A narrative paragraph explains something that happened. Write a brief narrative paragraph for each situation below. Use as many details as possible.

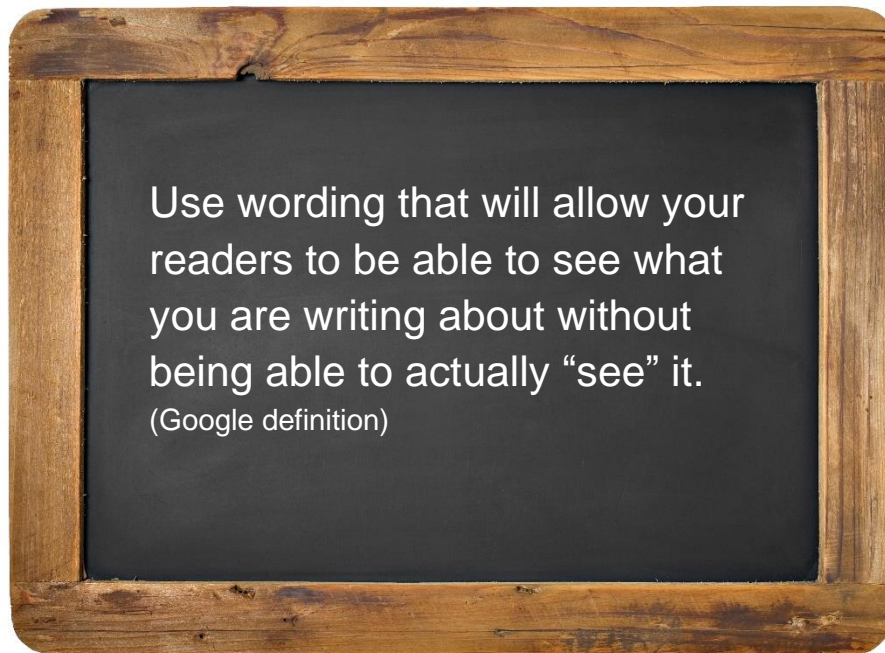


1. What is the best gift you ever received at Christmas? Explain. How did you react when you opened it?

Procedural text

Write simple procedural texts (e.g., instructions/directions) for the situation below.
